Lima is one of Latin America's major urban centers and home to over 10.4 million people in the Lima Metropolitan Area—representing about 30% of Peru's total population. This level of population concentration makes Lima a powerful place to learn how cities grow, how communities adapt, and how unequal access to health and basic services can develop over time.

While Peru has made progress in many areas, monetary poverty affected 29.0% of the country's population in 2023 (nearly 9.78 million people), and extreme poverty affected 5.7% (about 1.92 million people). These numbers highlight why long-term, community-led partnerships matter—especially in urban areas where rapid growth can intensify pressure on housing, employment, healthcare, and infrastructure.

Recommended For Students Who...

...want to learn in a dynamic urban environment while exploring how population growth and migration shape access to health and opportunity. Working alongside trusted local partners, participants gain a deeper understanding of the realities faced by underserved communities and the importance of responding with empathy, respect, and collaboration.

Students contribute through a community-driven model focused on long-term impact beyond a single visit, grounded in listening, local context, and sustainable partnership. Volunteers stay in Miraflores, a central and walkable district that supports daily logistics and provides space to reflect after each day's activities.

Cusco is a major cultural hub in Peru, home to over 428,000 people. The city sits at a high elevation of about 3,400 meters (11,150 feet), and while it's a thriving tourist destination, many of its neighboring communities still face significant challenges. In the Cusco region, a large portion of the population lives in extreme poverty, with over 30% of the rural population lacking access to basic services like healthcare, sanitation, and education. Despite the booming tourism industry, these disparities highlight the importance of long-term, community-driven projects that address the root causes of poverty.

Recommended For Students Who...

...are interested in the intersection of history and modern-day challenges faced by indigenous communities in the Andes. This destination is perfect for students eager to understand how pre-Inca, Inca, and Spanish histories converge and shape the lives of local populations.

Students will work on projects that empower communities and help develop solutions that are both sustainable and ethical. Volunteers will gain a deeper understanding of how cultural heritage and modern issues like healthcare access, economic disparities, and infrastructure intersect in the Cusco region.

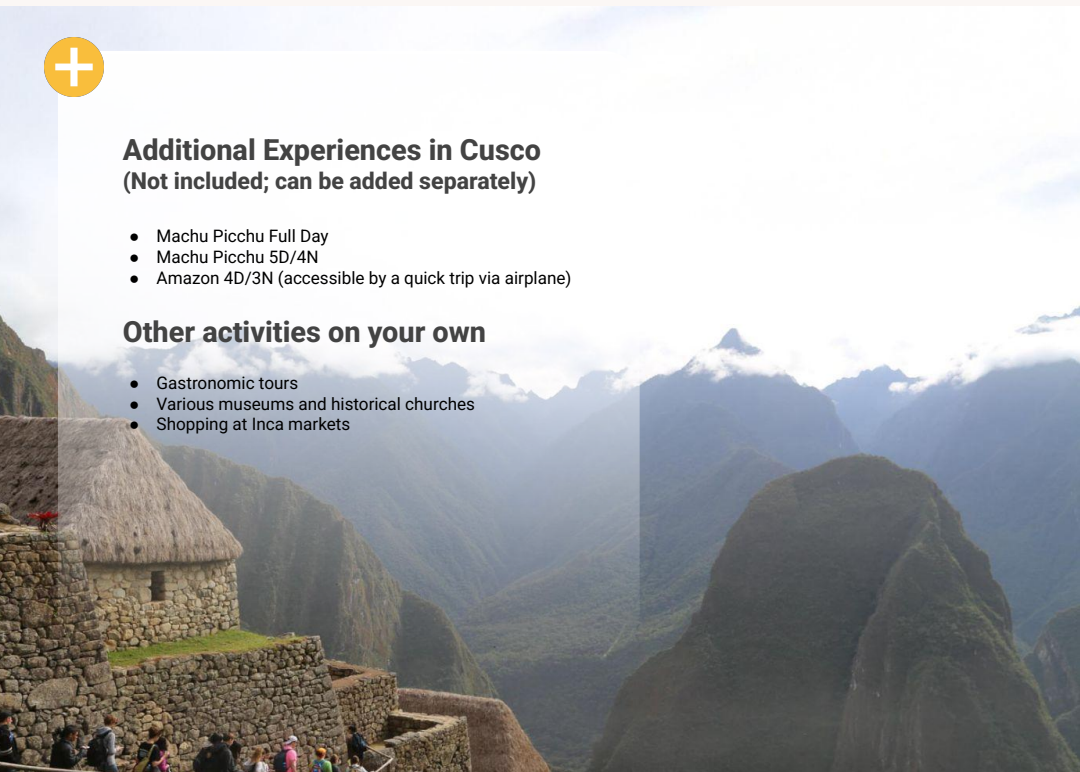

Riobamba is located in the heart of Ecuador's highlands, with a population of 459,000. Surrounded by majestic mountains and lush vegetation, it offers a serene and picturesque environment. However, Riobamba is one of Ecuador's poorest regions, where over 40% of the population lives in poverty. This includes many indigenous communities who face challenges like poor healthcare, inadequate sanitation, and limited access to education. The region's economic struggles are exacerbated by the isolation of rural areas, where families still live in extremely low-income conditions.

Recommended For Students Who...

...want to experience the tranquility of the Ecuadorian highlands while learning about the realities faced by indigenous communities. Riobamba offers a unique opportunity to understand how history and geography have shaped the living conditions of the local population.

Students will work alongside community leaders to implement long-term projects that will have a lasting impact on local families. This destination is perfect for volunteers eager to make a meaningful difference in an area that has been largely overlooked by traditional development efforts.

Tena is located in Ecuador's Amazon region, surrounded by rainforest and rich biodiversity. While the area is known for its natural environment, many indigenous and rural communities face persistent challenges related to geographic isolation, limited infrastructure, and restricted access to healthcare and essential services. These barriers make long-term, community-based health initiatives especially important. MEDLIFE has built a strong partnership in Tena with local and regional institutions to support sustainable healthcare access and ongoing community needs.

Due to its location, volunteers stay outside the city center, allowing for a focused and immersive experience centered on program activities and reflection. The setting encourages a slower pace and deeper engagement with the realities of rural healthcare delivery, emphasizing listening, collaboration, and respect for local context.

Recommended For Students Who...

...are interested in understanding healthcare access in remote and environmentally complex regions. Tena is ideal for students who want to learn how geography, infrastructure, and cultural context shape health outcomes in Amazonian communities.

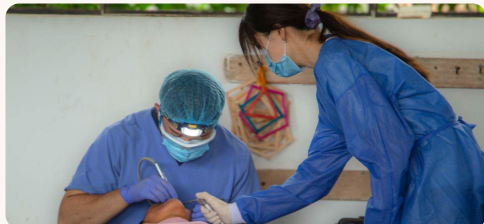

San José is Costa Rica's capital and cultural center, offering a window into the country's social, economic, and public health realities. While Costa Rica is often classified as a middle-income country, poverty and inequality persist, particularly in urban areas where access to consistent healthcare and preventive services remains uneven. In San José, these challenges are shaped by rapid urban growth, population density, and environmental factors.

Despite Costa Rica's global reputation as a tourist destination, its tropical climate presents ongoing public health concerns. Conditions such as stagnant water contribute to the spread of mosquito-borne illnesses, which continue to affect many local communities. MEDLIFE works alongside local partners in San José to address these challenges through long-term, community-based health initiatives focused on prevention, education, and access to care.

Recommended For Students Who...

...are interested in exploring public health challenges within an urban, middle-income context. San José is well suited for students who want to understand how environmental conditions, infrastructure, and social inequality intersect to impact health outcomes.

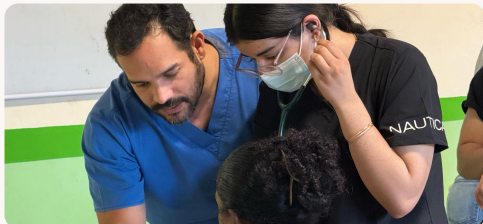

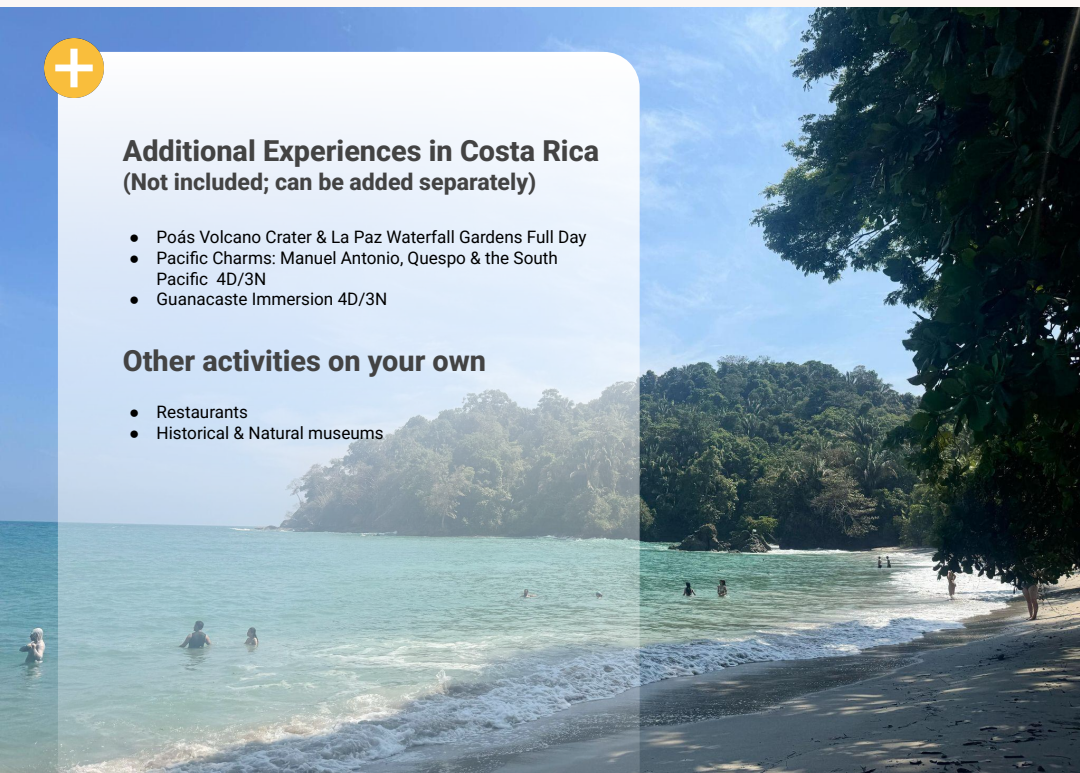

These conditions contribute to ongoing disparities in access to healthcare and essential services.

By focusing on prevention, education, and sustainable support, these efforts respond to the realities faced by communities living beyond the reach of the area's tourism economy.

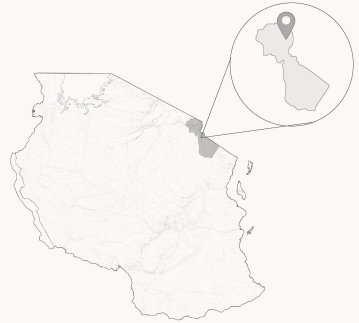

Kilimanjaro is a region in northern Tanzania where many communities face ongoing challenges related to access to healthcare, education, and essential services. While the area is internationally recognized for Mount Kilimanjaro, the realities of daily life for local populations are shaped by geographic distance, limited infrastructure, and economic constraints. These factors make sustained, community-based health initiatives especially important.

Volunteers stay in a remote setting outside major urban areas, creating a focused environment centered on program activities and collaboration with local partners. Occasional visits to nearby towns are organized for basic supplies, but the experience prioritizes engagement, reflection, and commitment over independent exploration. MEDLIFE's work in Kilimanjaro emphasizes long-term support, ethical partnership, and responsiveness to local needs.

Recommended For Students Who...

...are interested in learning about healthcare delivery in remote, resource-limited settings. Kilimanjaro is well suited for students who want to understand how geography, infrastructure, and access to education intersect to influence health outcomes.

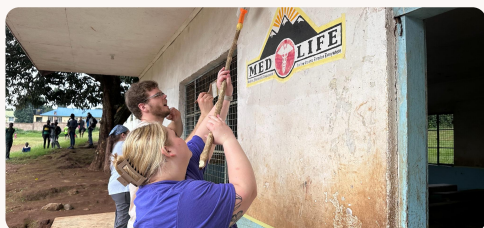

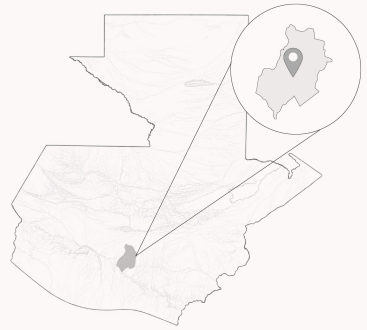

These conditions reflect broader structural inequalities that continue to shape daily life across the region.

MEDLIFE works with local partners in and around Antigua to support long-term, community-based health initiatives that respond to these realities. The focus is on sustainable engagement that addresses health access and education within a complex social and historical context, emphasizing collaboration and respect for local knowledge.
